

**CITY COUNCIL MEETING  
OZARK, ALABAMA  
TUESDAY, OCTOBER 15, 2019**

The City Council of the City of Ozark, Alabama, met in Regular Session in the Council Chamber of the Municipal Complex at 5:30 P.M. on Tuesday, October 15, 2019. Upon roll call the following members were present:

Also present: Denise Strickland, who acted as clerk of the meeting, Jim Outlaw, Tim Hicks, Philip Prince, Steve Sherrill, Joe Adams and Ryan Campbell.

Councilmember Simechak gave the prayer followed by Mayor Bunting leading everyone in the Pledge of Allegiance.

The Council having read the minutes from the Regular Council Meeting held on October 1, 2019 at 5:30 P.M. President Garrett asked the wishes of the Council. Councilmember Perault made a motion to approve the minutes of the Regular Council Meeting held on October 1, 2019, which motion was seconded by Councilmember Simechak. The Council voted unanimously in favor thereof.

President Garrett advised the Council it was time to set the Agenda and if there were any changes to be made. Councilmember Simechak made a motion to set the Agenda with the removal of 161 Candlewick Court from Item #6 and the addition of Item #10 approve the purchase of two (2) pickup trucks off the State Bid in the amount of \$21,677 each and the addition of Item #11 approving a Downtown Entertainment District event for the United Way on Thursday, October 17, 2019, which motion was seconded by Councilmember Enfinger. The Council voted unanimously in favor thereof.

Councilmember Perault made a motion to declare properties located at 203 Roosevelt Street and 257 West Parker Street a Public Nuisance, which motion was seconded by Councilmember Simechak. The Council voted unanimously in favor thereof.

Councilmember Enfinger introduced a Resolution Declaring Certain Properties located at 506 Robin Parker Road, 674 Newton Street and 652 West College Street a Public Nuisance and Setting a Public Hearing for November 19, 2019 at 5:00 PM and moved for its adoption, which motion was seconded by Councilmember Simechak. The Council voted unanimously in favor thereof.

Councilmember Simechak introduced Resolutions Confirming the Cost of Weed Liens at 163 Troy Street, 5978 Andrews Avenue, 551 Newton Street, 2821 North Union Avenue and 255 John D. Seifert Drive and moved for their adoption, which motion was seconded by Councilmember Perault. The Council voted unanimously in favor thereof.

Councilmember Enfinger made a motion to approve funding from an Airport Grant from the Alabama Department of Transportation for the construction of T-Hangars at the Ozark Municipal Airport in the amount of \$250,000, which motion was seconded by Councilmember Simechak. The Council voted unanimously in favor thereof.

Councilmember Perault made a motion to authorize the Mayor to seek Local Financing for the cost of construction of T-Hangars at the Ozark Municipal Airport not covered by the Grant from the Alabama Department of Transportation (approximately \$300,000), which motion was seconded by Councilmember Simechak. The Council voted unanimously in favor thereof.

Councilmember Simechak made a motion to approve the purchase of two (2) pickup trucks off the State Bid in the amount of \$21,677 each, one to be used by the Leisure Services Department and one to be used by the Public Works Department, which motion was seconded by Councilmember Enfinger. The Council voted unanimously in favor thereof.

Councilmember Simechak made a motion to approve a Downtown Entertainment District event for the United Way on Thursday, October 17, 2019, which motion was seconded by Councilmember Perault. The Council voted unanimously in favor thereof.

Council President Garrett advised the Council that there was a Court Report in their packets for review.

With there being no further business to come before this Regular Council Meeting of October 15, 2019, Councilmember Simechak made a motion to adjourn the meeting, which motion was seconded by Councilmember Enfinger. The Council voted unanimously in favor thereof.
